

# Aliens HAVE landed!

## INSISTS THE AUTHOR OF COMPELLING NEW BOOK

**A** LIEN mystery expert Timothy Good makes the bold claim that evidence for the existence of UFOs is indisputable.

His latest book puts forward a strong case, backed by official documents and eye-witness accounts from unimpeachable sources such as astronomers, pilots and astronauts.

"In the US, tens of thousands of UFO-related documents have been released by the armed forces and intelligence agencies since the Freedom Of Information Act became law in 1966, after years of denying any such information existed," said Tim.

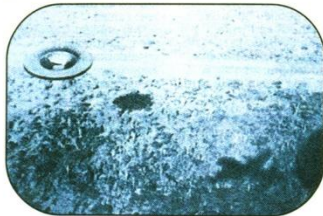
"Governments began paying attention to strange goings-on in the sky at the outbreak of the First World War but, in 1920, the public's imagination was really stirred by the disappearance of a ship, and the aircraft sent to look for it, after mysterious lights were seen in the Bass Strait between Australia and New Zealand.

### Thousands of witnesses

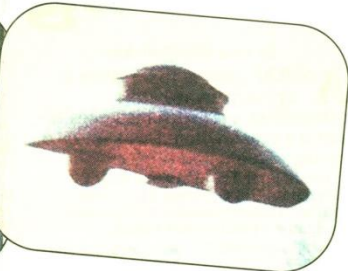
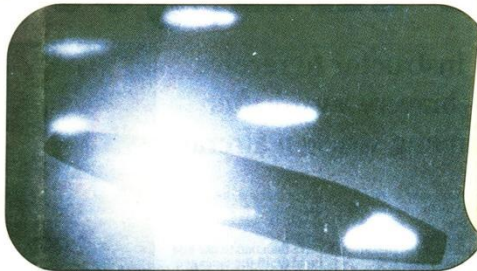
"In the decades since, similar reports have been regularly catalogued all around the world.

"In 1942, for instance, less than three months after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, which brought America into the Second World War, thousands of witnesses saw a large object remain stationary over Los Angeles while taking direct hits from anti-aircraft guns before simply moving off, apparently untouched.

"Later that year, a Royal Australian Air Force crew reported an object that matched the classic

description of a flying saucer flying alongside their plane before diving into the sea."

As UFO sightings increased, Governments began to link them with the dawn of the Earth's Atomic Age and the danger our planet could become a threat to other worlds.

A series of science-fiction films like *The Day The Earth Stood Still* reflected a growing anxiety and paranoia of superior intelligences monitoring the human race — as did the Martians in *War Of The Worlds*.

"One event in July, 1947, that inspired countless articles, books and even a feature film, became known as The Roswell Incident, when at least one unusual aerial vehicle crashed on a ranch in New Mexico," claimed Tim.

"An initial Press release stating the Army had a flying saucer in its possession was

withdrawn and replaced by a statement that the wreckage was only the remains of a weather balloon.

"More sensational were reports of aliens being found — one still alive — and a famous photo showing what is purported to be one of them on an autopsy table.

### Alien bodies

"A 'highly credible' witness claimed to have examined an alien corpse and gave a description of the body. "Still, the whole episode is shrouded in mystery.

"A book written by a former head of the US Army's Foreign Technology Division and a member of the National Security Council under President Eisenhower claimed that alien materials and devices found in the saucer became models for modern technology like integrated circuits,

lasers and advanced weaponry."

A lesser-known incident, but one as important as Roswell, according to Tim, involved the controlled landing of an alien craft in 1948, again in New Mexico.

The 100-foot diameter disc, made of a very light metal, was impervious to diamond-tipped drills or temperatures of 10,000°F. Inside were the bodies of 16 small humanoids, and an autopsy on a female estimated she was 200 years old.

The apparent concentration of alien interest on New Mexico was attributed to a trio of advanced and powerful radar sites guarding top secret military bases.

The list of highly-respectable people putting the case for the existence of UFOs is compelling.

In 1950, no less a dignitary than Earl Mountbatten Of Burma wrote of the superiority

of alien craft, and suggested the human race may have to band together to survive.

Tim goes on to catalogue a series of unexplained UFO sightings around the world, described by many witnesses of the utmost integrity.

One involved the 12-man crew of a USAF flight from Hawaii to Tokyo, who saw a large unknown object fly alongside them for an hour.

When they landed, the flight commander put the crew in separate rooms and told them to write down what they'd seen, following Pentagon instructions. Their accounts were sent to Washington — no more was heard about them.

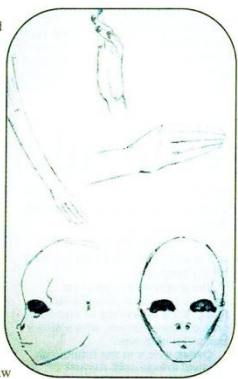
### Abducted

In 1959, six USAF jets attempted to capture a UFO spotted in Oregon, but it shot straight upwards and none of the planes could keep up with it, as it constantly changed course to evade them.

"A new development came in 1975 when a USAF flight mechanic, again in New Mexico, claimed to have been abducted by aliens who hypnotised him while he was watching a meteor shower from his car," continued Tim.

"When he came to, he couldn't account for over an hour, but his memory gradually returned, and he described being taken aboard an alien craft and shown how it was propelled.

"The mechanic, who had high security clearance, was swiftly transferred to Spain, but a psychological evaluation indicated he was probably telling the truth.



"Another uncantry story from Brazil involves a description of surgery on a small, semi-human alien with a broken leg in 1996. The creature showed no signs of pain and made no attempt to communicate, but its fractured leg almost completely healed within 24 hours."

Tim catalogues a series of sightings from every continent, complete with radio dialogue where pilots describe what they're seeing to Air Traffic Control.

Last year, a craft was seen by a group of airport employees, hovering over Chicago's O'Hare Airport. The object was dismissed as a weather phenomenon by the Federal Aviation Administration, but eye-witnesses were certain it wasn't a craft known to man.

Tim concludes the facts about UFOs and their threat to Earth are being kept under wraps, especially by the US. "We can only guess," he wrote, "at what's being withheld and, under the circumstances, gradual disclosure is probably the best way to avoid panic and the risk of social upheaval."

## Hide. Then say hello. Or just shoot — here comes ET!

ARE we in danger of an imminent alien attack? Well, in the United States, UFO boffins seem to think we are, writes Jeremiah Ware.

It's also more than likely that, when our little extra-terrestrial "friends" arrive, they won't be so friendly! According to Travis Taylor and Bob Boan in their new book, *An Introduction To Planetary Defense*, now is the time to start planning for such an event.

Using possible scenarios from science fiction, the authors have based their answers on scientific and military fact. With degrees in astronomy and physics, they are well versed in

giving us the information that could save our lives if the "little green men" arrive.

The bad news is that current technology won't be adequate to defend ourselves. The good news, however, is that there are already technicians working on future weapons and technology that will help.

Armour suits for current soldiers are vastly improved from just a few years ago, and will be improved even further in the future.

It's also likely that a possible invasion will see ETs unprepared for our atmosphere and viruses and diseases. As seen in HG Wells' *War Of The Worlds*, the aliens were defeated by a simple cold virus, and biological warfare will be a likely asset for the human race to win.

### Could be friendly

If aliens attack our planet in UFOs, it's considerably likely that the spaceship will have a shield of some type, that will deflect any bombardment thrown at it. The solution would be similar to that seen in Hollywood blockbuster, *Independence Day*, where we could slip a nuclear warhead through the shield before detonating it.

Of course, any ETs that take an interest in Earth could also conceivably be friendly. So Taylor and Boan came up with this sequence of events: first, try to hide, then say hello, then warn them, and then shoot — or maybe just shoot first!
